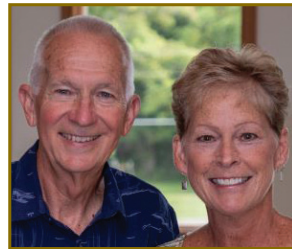

## Tuesday Morning

### Kyle Boone

#### *Pastoring Through Domestic Abuse*

One of four women experiences domestic abuse. Several in your congregation most likely have or will face domestic abuse. Pastors often function as the initial confidant. This seminar will give small-town pastors an understanding of abuse dynamics, a theological framework, and practical points.

### David & Louise Decker

#### *'M' is for Marriage ... 'M' is for Ministry ... Are Your M&M's Melting?*

If you are married and in ministry, there are always challenges. Dealing with the balance takes work. How do you deal with the push and pull? Join us as we look at ways ministry and marriage don't just co-exist but thrive.

### Marty Giese

#### *Evangelism in a Rural Context: Sharing Christ in a Place with Few Strangers*

One of the challenges of evangelism in rural settings is significant long-term social exposure within rural communities. Evangelists in this setting face dynamics similar to sharing the Gospel with members of their immediate family. In this seminar we're going to talk about how to effectively equip church members to share their faith with people they know well.

### Steve Mathewson

#### *Preaching the Old Testament Wisdom Books*

The books of Proverbs, Job, and Ecclesiastes can be difficult to interpret and challenging to preach, yet they have much wisdom to offer small-town churches and their pastors. They teach us how to live so that life goes well (Proverbs), how to live when life gets turned upside down (Job), and how to live with the reality that life is fleeting and frustrating (Ecclesiastes). This seminar will help small-town pastors understand how to preach these books effectively.

### Shawn McMullen

#### *Practical Steps for Developing Leaders in the Town and Country Church*

We often wish we had better leaders in the churches we serve. This seminar addresses the need for quality spiritual leaders in the church and provides practical suggestions for developing them.

### Jeff VanGoethem

#### *Given the Times in Which We Live, How Should Pastors Be Praying?*

We see the evangelical church largely in decline. We see our nation in spiritual and moral free fall. These are times to really pray! This seminar will explore some biblical teaching on deeper and more extraordinary prayer.

#### *The Big Challenge of the New Rural Poor*

Over the past 40 years, rural villages have become pockets of inner-city-like poverty. Differing from the traditional rural poor in many ways, these new rural poor can present challenges to the church in the smallest of towns. We'll learn what makes this ministry so challenging and some successful strategies for engaging it.

God calls us to holiness even as He is holy (1 Pet. 1:15,16). How do we translate His call into a practical kind of ministry that can transform church members and draw unbelievers to Christ? This seminar examines God's call to holy living and its importance in town and country ministry and suggests practical steps in our pursuit of holiness.

#### *The Hard and Happy Task of Personal Discipleship for the Small-Town Pastor*

In this seminar, we'll think about why personal discipleship can be a challenge for rural pastors but also why it's very doable and crucially important. We'll consider simple and practical steps to invest in others to help them grow spiritually.

Inertia is a significant challenge for rural churches in socio-culturally stable settings. Churches and ministries can get 'stuck' - losing vision and accepting the status quo. In this seminar we're going to talk about how to get 'unstuck' and ignite fresh ministry momentum in our churches.

#### *Living Well with Conflict*

In ministry all over the world, there is conflict. The smaller our community or ministry team, the more amplified any conflict feels. Jesus had a ministry team and lived in small communities, too. Using visual illustrations and practical exercises, let's explore how to follow Him in living well with the inevitable conflicts that come as humans live and work together.
